

Queer-Allied Entertainment and Media Companies in LA

Los Angeles is the entertainment capital of the world, but it can be hard for queer artists in LA to find companies that champion LGBTQ+ voices. Below, Queersource LA has compiled a list of queer-allied entertainment and media companies dedicated to empowering members of the queer community.

Entertainment Companies

Producer Entertainment Group

Producer Entertainment Group (PEG) is a premiere **talent management company for queer performers** in Los Angeles. The company represents some of the most well-known drag queens from RuPaul's drag race.

PEG **accepts interns** in the fall, spring and summer.



The Celebration Theatre

Celebration is an award-winning **theater company** dedicated to empowering the LGBTQ+ community by producing **queer shows**.

The theater was founded in 1982 by Charles Rowland, a gay rights activist who was also a founding member of the Mattachine Society.

Celebration **accepts interns** every summer.

Women's Center for Creative Work

The Women's Center for Creative Work is a space for Los Angeles' **feminist creative community** to produce art that **empowers** women and femme-identifying members of the queer community.

Every summer, the WCCW offers **paid internships** for students who apply through the Los Angeles County Arts Commission grant.





The Commons LA

The Commons LA is a **queer film and theatre production company** that produces **new work** by diverse artists whose voices are often overlooked in the entertainment industry.

The Commons LA values inclusivity and welcomes everyone, regardless of race, gender, religion, identity or orientation, to **join their company**.

The Ruby LA

The Ruby LA is a **comedy school and theater** centered around the ideals of **intersectional feminism**. It is an inclusive space where women, people of color, and LGBTQ+ people can take classes and create comedy shows for the Los Angeles community.

Although The Ruby LA does not accept interns, they do **offer scholarships for students** to take any class they'd like at the theater.



Media Companies



GLAAD

GLAAD is a non-governmental organization founded by LGBTQ+ journalists, and it's one of Hollywood's most powerful **media monitoring entities**. According to *The Los Angeles Times*, GLAAD is "**one of the most successful organizations lobbying the media for inclusion.**"

GLAAD Media **offers internships** for college students in the fall, spring and summer.

BuzzFeed
